Apertures and F stops

Aperture means the opening of. In this case were looking at the opening of your lens. This is normally associated with **F stop**. On most lens, The f-stops go from the widest opening of f 1.8 to f 22.

The students were also taught what f stop gives them what is called shallow dept of field. Shallow dept of field happens when the aperture of the lens is at its widest opening. Thus you achieve a blurry effect in the background as shown here at the photo on the right.
