ACADEMIC DISCIPLINE

The Board of Trustees of the University of the South Pacific, in its capacity as the governing body of the University, has adopted the following regulations for the purpose of maintaining the standards of academic discipline and the integrity of the University.

MERITS

- (a) Degree in full honors
- (b) Degree in very good honors
- (c) Degree in good honors
- (d) Degree in fair honors
- (e) Degree in poor honors
- (f) Degree in very poor honors
- (g) Degree in unsatisfactory honors
- (h) Degree in unsatisfactory honors (with conditions)
- (i) Degree in unsatisfactory honors (with conditions)
- (j) Degree in unsatisfactory honors (with conditions)

DEMERITS

- (a) Unlawful conduct
- (b) Fraud
- (c) Plagiarism
- (d) Misconduct
- (e) Abuse of privilege
- (f) Insubordination
- (g) Intimidation
- (h) Disrespectful behavior

When the Board of Trustees is satisfied that a student has committed an offence under these regulations, it may, in its discretion, impose any of the following penalties:

- (a) A warning
- (b) A reprimand
- (c) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding one year
- (d) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding two years
- (e) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding three years
- (f) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding four years
- (g) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding five years
- (h) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding six years
- (i) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding seven years
- (j) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding eight years
- (k) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding nine years
- (l) A suspension from the University for a period not exceeding ten years

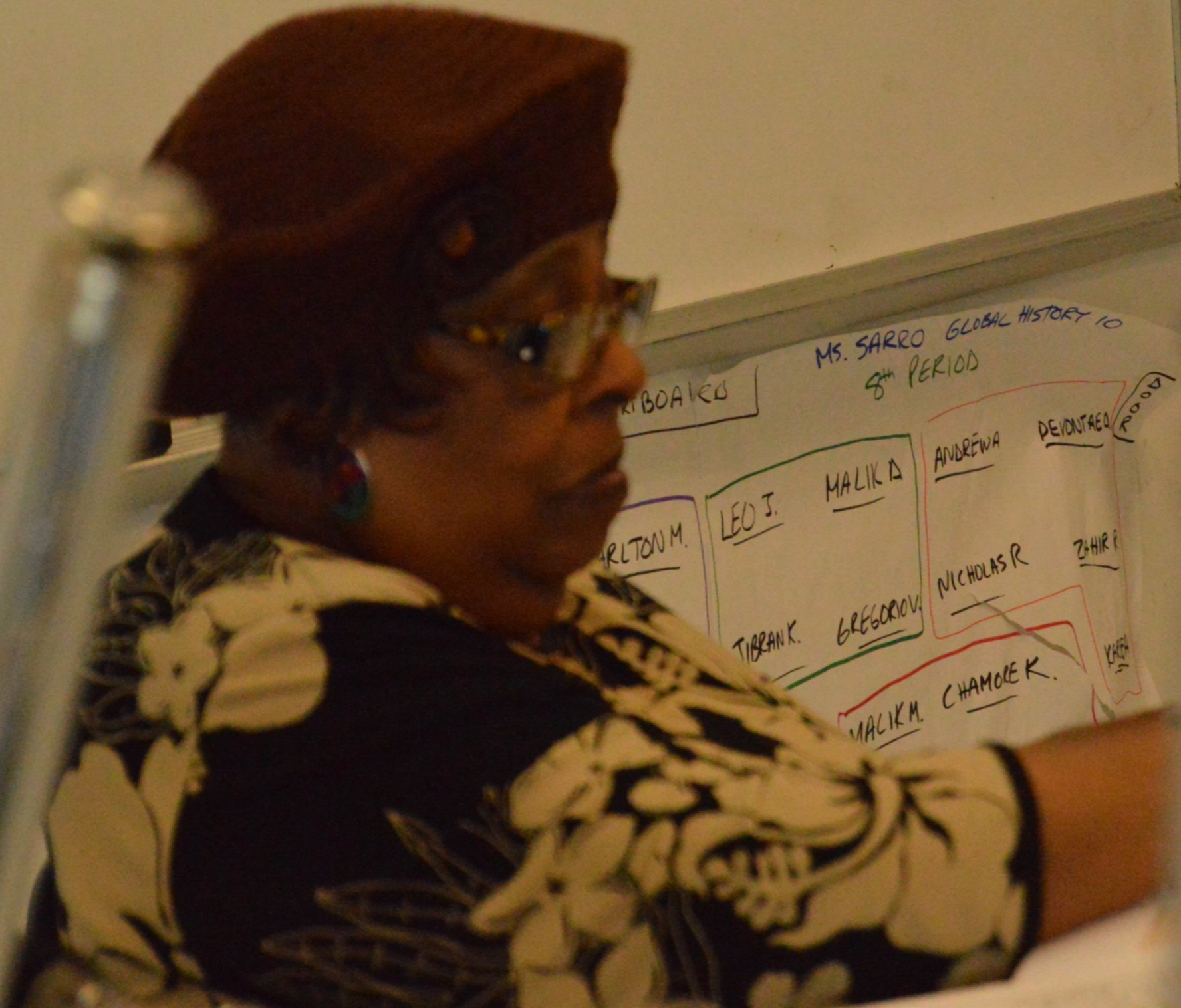

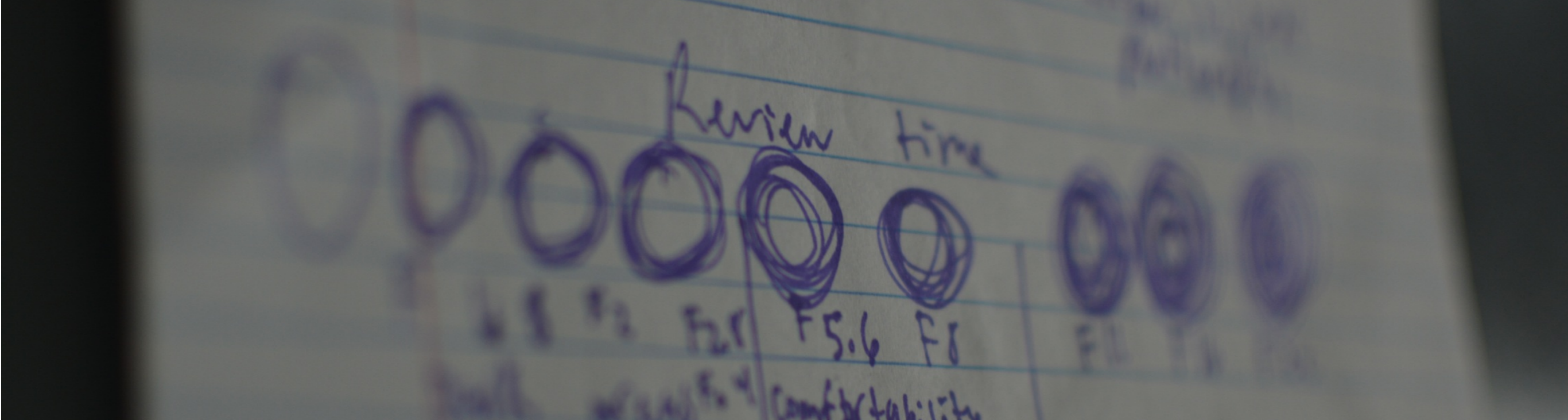

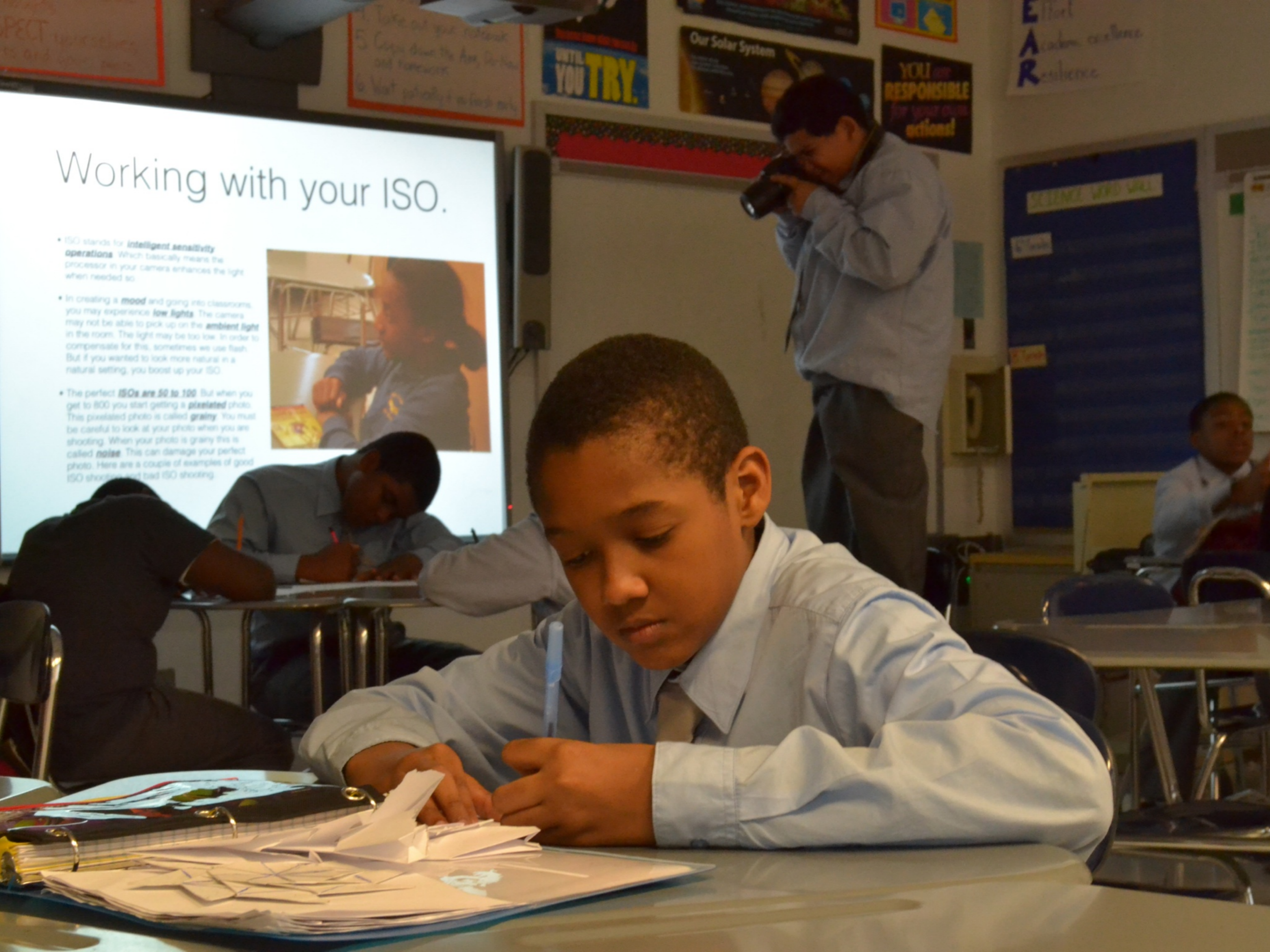
What is the eye more than an optical nerve that awares man of the world around him. It is said that the eye is greedy. It never has enough sight and can not be fulfilled. Cameras have brought the modern age history to the door steps of our mind. There is your freedom and expression.



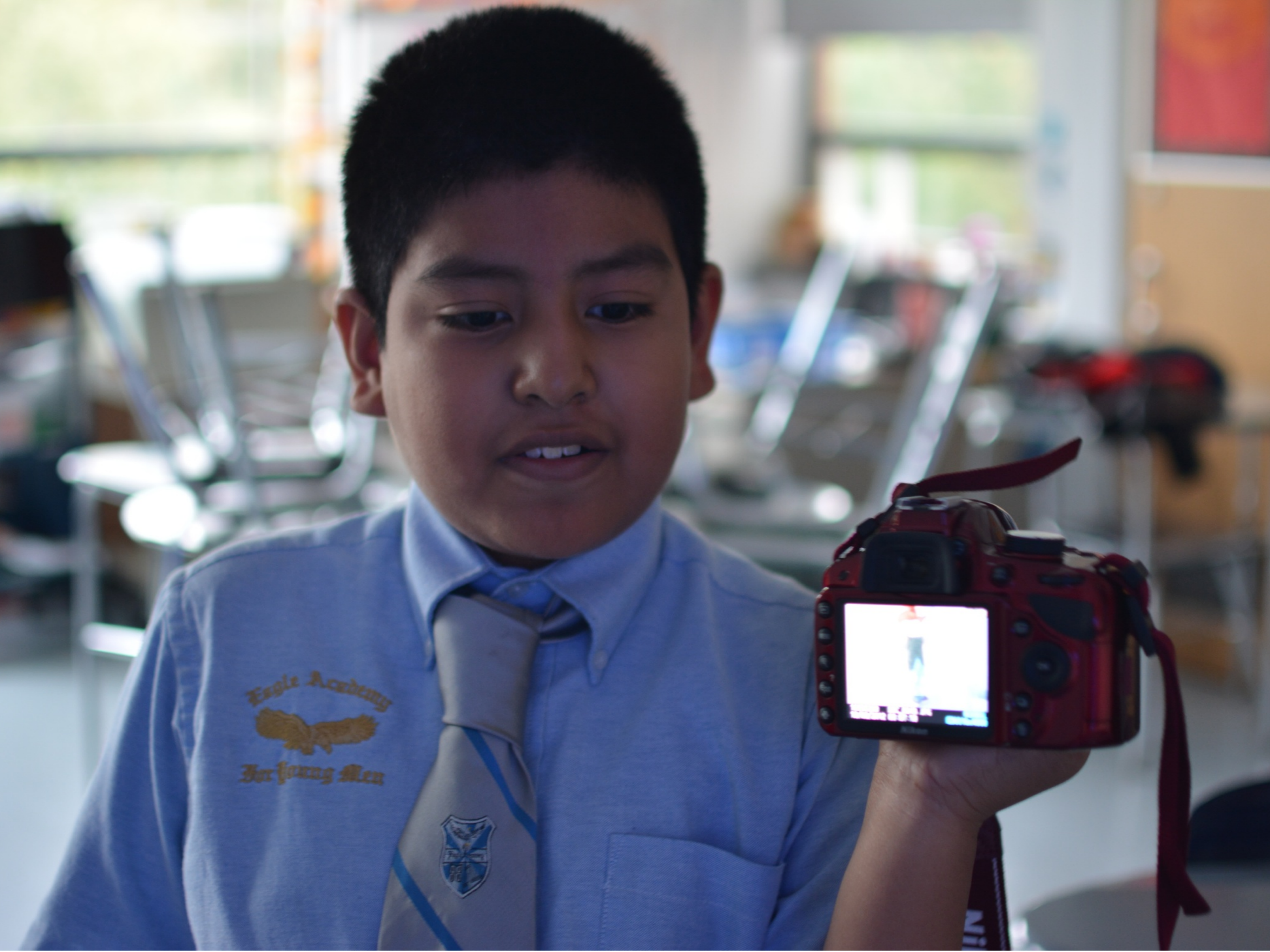


Working with your ISO.

- ISO stands for **intelligent sensitivity operations**. Which basically means the processor in your camera enhances the light when needed to.
- In creating a **mood** and going into classrooms, you may experience **low lights**. The camera may not be able to pick up on the **ambient light** in the room. The light may be too low. In order to compensate for this, sometimes we use flash. But if you wanted to look more natural in a natural setting, you boost up your ISO.
- The perfect **ISOs are 50 to 100**. But when you get to 800 you start getting a **pixelated** photo. This pixelated photo is called **grainy**. You must be careful to look at your photo when you are shooting. When your photo is grainy this is called **noise**. This can damage your perfect photo. Here are a couple of examples of good ISO shooting and bad ISO shooting.

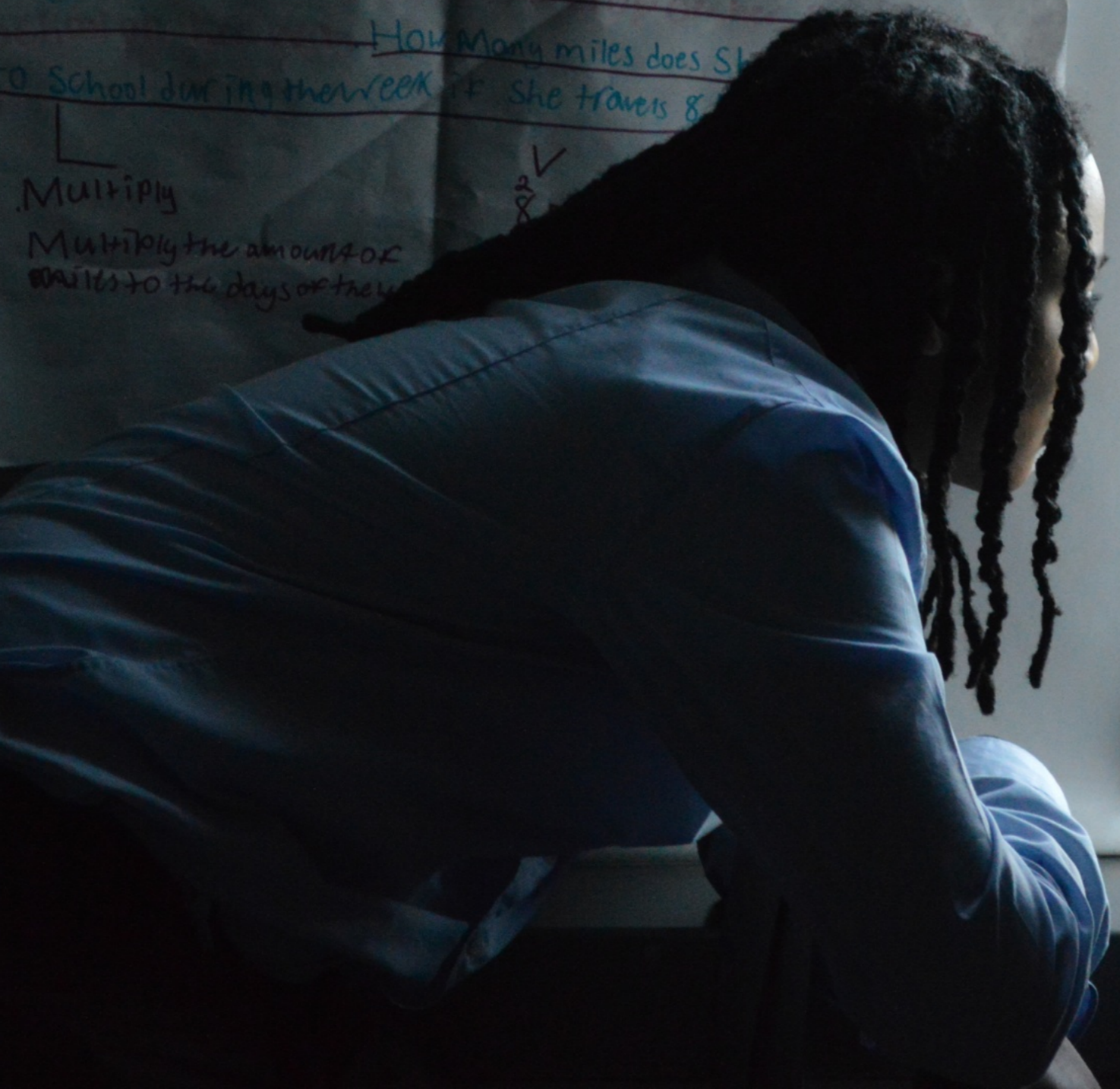
